FCCWA Code of Conduct for all members

Did you know that FCCWA has a code of conduct? A code of conduct is really important because it acts as a guide and reference for all members. It helps to clarify FCCWA's values and principles and is a visible statement to the rest of the world what we stand for. Anyone who deals with FCCWA can look at our Code of Conduct and they will get a sense of who we are and what is important to us. Our Code of Conduct incorporates the standard of ethics that our breeders abide by and provides a reference point for Governing Council when they are dealing with any situations that may arise.

Below is the purpose and general principles of our code of conduct, but if you would like to read it in full, it can be found on our website www.fcc-wa.com

1 Purpose of the Code of Conduct

- 1.1 To provide members of the Feline Control Council WA (Inc) with a framework for appropriate conduct. This includes behaviour towards other FCCWA members, judges, general community members and cats.
- 1.2 The core principles that underpin the organisation must be the welfare of all cats that fall within the scope of FCCWA and the protection of the integrity of FCCWA pedigrees
- 1.3 Incorporated in this Code of Conduct is a Code of Ethics for all members who wish to be recognised as Registered Breeders. All FCCWA Registered breeders must agree to uphold and respect this Code of Ethics in their actions and dealings within the Cat Fancy.

2 General Principles of Conduct

General principles to guide the behaviour of FCCWA members include that all members must:

- a) Act with reasonable care and diligence
- b) Act with honesty and integrity
- c) Act lawfully
- d) Avoid damage to the reputation of the FCCWA (Inc)
- e) Treat others with respect and fairness.
- f) Abide by any rules, regulations or guidelines as determined by FCCWA (Inc) including Breeding, Showing, membership of Governing Council or any other activity. Such regulations will be available on the FCCWA website.
- g) Comply with the WA Cat Act (2011) and any other relevant legislation.

Constitutional and Show Rules Review

Over the years FCCWA has developed a Constitution and a set of Show Rules. They have served us well over the years, but in order to ensure continuous improvement it is important to review these documents from time to time to check whether changes are necessary.

DOCEP has developed model rules which may impact the constitution. In addition, the introduction of a website, the use of emails as a communication tool and the increase in popularity of owner-cages (for example) means that some of our rules need adjusting.

In addition, in our fast moving electronic world, some of the deadlines that were set in the past are no longer necessary or practical.

Governing Council have recently reviewed our rules and will be publicizing proposed changes over the coming months. Any amendments to the constitution must be done at an AGM or at a Special Meeting, so you will have the opportunity to vote on changes.





Feeding Cats a Natural Diet

The Cat family (felids) have evolved closely along side their canine counterparts, but have developed their own unique dietary requirements as a result of their own unique dietary intake. Cats, unlike dogs, are obligate carnivores, which means they must have meat in their diet to live (dogs can live on a vegetarian diet). Cats require significantly larger amounts of protein in their diet, as well as fats, and less carbohydrate and vegetable matter. Cats must have a dietary source of the amino acid taurine, which is only naturally found in meat (but easily destroyed by cooking), and the essential fatty acid arachidonic acid, also found in animal fats.

Cats have evolved as a finely tuned hunting machine, which parallels their need for fresh meat and animal fats in their diet. The structure of their bodies, teeth, claws, and digestive tracts are finely tuned to catch and process live prey. Cats, unlike dogs, will rarely touch carrion (old dead meat/carcass), and will not scavenge like dogs. They always prefer fresh meat/prey, and as such, are rarely poisoned or take baits. This is also why they can be fussy eaters, and will rarely be tricked into taking medication mixed in their food.

They have evolved to exist in the most arid environments (originally from Egypt), which is why they thrive in the Australian bush. Their urinary system has evolved to enable them to conserve water very effectively, producing a highly concentrated urine (the strong smell we all know well) and requiring only minute amounts of water each day. They do this by absorbing up to 80% of their water requirements from their live prey, and hence they need to drink very rarely. This is why I believe that the practice of feeding dry food rations to cats is totally wrong, and results in the high levels of urinary tract disorders and renal failure we see in cats today. Unless cats adapt quickly, and dramatically increase their water intake to compensate for the lack of moisture in the food, their urinary system is forced to produce more and more concentrated urine, which results in crystal formation, PH imbalance, and renal overload.

Cats are unable to properly cope with long term dry food intake, and will not live to their full potential on this type of ration, no matter how good or expensive the product.

So what should a modern cat eat? A diet based on high levels of fresh raw meats (high in protein and fat), with a correct balance of carbohydrate and vegetable matter. Because raw meat does not equal an entire carcass, complete with organs, digestive tract, bones and fur or feathers, additional supplements are required to "top up" the basic diet. Additional yeast, kelp, lecithin, calcium, and vitamin C can provide all the extra natural elements (vitamins, minerals, and trace elements) found in a natural live prey diet. It is important to remember that cats do ingest grass and other green matter as part of their natural diet, so this must be accounted for also, in the form of vegetables and wheat grass.


All these elements and necessary supplements are provided for in Vets All Natural Complete Mix for cats. The feeding chart is calculated on the higher need for raw meats and fat, and the mix itself is balanced to provide all the additional elements in the correct amounts. Naturally, many cats may put up a fuss if their regular food is changed, but if you are serious about good health and long life for your cats, persevere with the new diet and you will eventually convince your feline companions that fresh is best.

Feeding Cats a Natural Diet (cont'd)

Note: for really fussy cats, try soaking the mix in chicken stock, and mix a few sardines in with the whole meal. Get them used to eating raw meat first, and add the mix gradually, over a week or so.

Cat Act 2011 Update

In December 2012 the Minister's Office released a set of regulations in support of the Cat Act 2011. Excluded from the regulations are a fee structure and the number of cats that Councils will allow members of registering organisations to keep.

The issue of fees and the numbers of cats allowable to members of FCCWA is still being considered by the Minister for Local Government's Office and additional regulations are being worked on. From December 2012 until March 2013 the Government was in caretaker mode in preparation for the state election. The Liberal Party was returned, but with changes to the composition to the cabinet. The portfolio of Local Government was allocated to the member for Darling Range, Tony Simpson.

The Tripartite Cat Laws group has contacted Minister Simpson to reiterate our position. We have not received any formal response but have been assured by the Minister's staff that the Minister has been briefed on the Cat Laws and that the intent is still to introduce legislation that will set higher limits for breeders and show enthusiasts provided that they are financial members of one of the three prescribed organisations and are abiding by the appropriate codes of behaviour. This is scheduled to happen mid year, though given the delays so far, we will believe this when we see it. The issue of fees will be addressed at the same time.

To date, we have provided a considerable amount of information but we still have concerns because there has been little actual dialogue. However, we will continue to advocate on behalf of all three West Australian organisations and do our best to get our message through. Any further updates will be provided via Cat Call, the website or the Facebook Show page.

Some of the features of the Cat Bill that will directly impact FCCWA members were listed in the previous Cat Calls, but it is worth just highlighting some of them again:

- All cats over the age of 6 months must be registered with the Local Government in the area that they live.
- All cats must wear registration tags in a public place unless they belong to a class of cats who
 are exempt.
- All cats over the age of 6 months old must be microchipped
- All cats over the age of 6 months old must be sterilised unless they are exempt. A cat that is kept for the purposes of breeding is exempt
- A person is not permitted to transfer ownership of a cat that is not sterilised unless the purchaser is an approved breeder. The cat must also be microchipped. If the cat is less than 6 months old, it may be transferred unsterilised provided that a voucher for sterilisation is part of the transfer.
